Students submit written work or perform before a panel of judges. Students may be asked to respond to questions on an individual basis. Students receive written feedback from the judges. The winners are announced the week following the competition during the awards program. The awards ceremony will occur Tuesday, May 2, 1995 at Washtenaw Community College Career and Job Skills Center.

The national competition will be announced. First place winners represent the branch. They are given an all-expense paid trip to the competition. The procedure is similar to the local competition.


