

Recycling Drop Off Stations





Glass Bottles and Jars

Food and beverage containers of any color are acceptable. Rinse out, and remove lids. Labels and neck rings do not have to be removed. Window glass, dinnerware, drinking glasses and other non-food glass are not



Aluminum Cans, Trays and Foil

Rinse out and flatten. No aluminum cookware.



Newspapers, Magazines, Phonebooks and Paperback Books

No hard cover books.

Earthfriendly tip:

Consider passing on old magazines and paperbacks to Senior Centers or Nursing homes. Check with your local school, too. Teachers often use magazines for student projects.




Metal Cans and Lids

Remove labels, rinse out and flatten when possible. Empty paint cans are not acceptable.




Plastic Bottles-#1 PETE & #2 HDPE

Small mouthed bottles only. Common examples are milk jugs, shampoo bottles, laundry detergent bottles. No margarine tubs or wide mouth containers. No plastic bags, lids or motor oil containers.



Corrugated Cardboard

Boxes must be flattened to maximize space. No waxed cardboard. Put into compartment with newspapers.



Boxboard and Paper Bags

Boxboard examples are cereal boxes, tissue boxes, shoe boxes, canned beverage boxes, backs of note pads, paper towel and toilet tissue tubes and paper egg cartons. Frozen food boxes are not acceptable.

Other Drop Off Services

Household Batteries can be dropped of in the designated container located inside the Township Civic Center Lobby, Monday - Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Used Motor Oil, Oil Filters and Antifreeze are accepted at the Township Compost Center at 2600 E. Clark Road. April through November, Monday - Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Saturdays, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. December through March, Saturday hours only.
