CODE: (see above)

- A. Take to Hazardous Waste Collection Site — Wayne Disposal — call 697-7830.
- B. Return to Manufacturer or call Health Department — 994-2492/Ecology Center — call 761-3188.
- C. Take to Ecology Center — Recycling Station located at 2050 S. Industrial Highway, Ann Arbor, MI — call 665-6398. Call the Ecology Center for location of nearest oil recycling station.
- D. Evaporate & Dispose with Refuse — allow liquids to evaporate in a safe, outdoor location, then wrap securely and dispose with other household refuse.
- E. Reuse — let sediment settle to the bottom and pour off liquid for reuse. Wrap securely and dispose with other household refuse.
- F. Solidify & Dispose with Refuse — if the waste is a liquid, mix in a container with soil until absorbed. Wrap securely in a plastic garbage bag and dispose of with other household refuse.
- G. Dispose with Refuse — wrap securely in a garbage bag and dispose of with household refuse.
- H. Pour Down Drain — when using on-site septic tank and drainfield, do not pour antifreeze down drain. Instead use option D.
